COUNCIL/COMMITTEE REPORTS	
Stroke Advisory Council	Mr. Wronski announced the Destination Protocol has been approved. Changes were made to the first draft when JCAHO accredited an additional level of service. The Thombectomy Capable Stroke Center Designation was added to the Stroke Regulation and to the protocol. This protocol will help agencies determine where a patient should go. Discussion followed. Mr. Wronski added this Protocol is mandatory 1 year from the date the Regulation goes into effect, sometime in the summer of 2019.
Trauma Advisory Council Stop the Bleed Day	Ms. Moore announced National Stop the Bleed Day is March 30 th . DHEC is using an HPP grant to get a Stop the Bleed kit in each public school in the state. DHEC will be responsible for the training.
EMS for Children Pediatric Trauma Symposium	Ms. Moore said the Annual Pediatric Trauma Symposium was held in Greenville on February 16 th . This year's symposium was the largest ever, with 180 individuals in attendance. Ms. Moore added the 2019 Pediatric Trauma Symposium will be held in Columbia.
EMS for Children Grant	Ms. Moore reported she submitted the EMS for Children grant in January and has received word that it has been approved.
Deta Occasiona Commission	
Data Oversight Committee	Mr. Shivar reported the Committee will begin to focus on not just gathering data, but gathering good quality data.
Facility Codes	The Committee will also be working on the facility codes, to make sure the same address is not entered in the national system several time in different ways.
Data Managers' Training	The Committee will be discussing the idea that Data Managers should have at least 1 initial workshop or training, along the lines of the Medical Control Physicians' Workshop.

Part-C Ventilator Settings Form	Dr. DesChamps stated if an agency is transporting a ventilator patient, the Ventilator Settings Form must be

completed and signed. He asked the Council to review the form for approval. Discussion followed. Ms. Youmans made the motion to accept the form and Dr. Gainey seconded. Discussion followed. The motion passed. Ms. Neely reported openings in the following positions: Membership Update SC Hospital Association State Board for Technical and Comprehensive Education The Governor's Office of Highway safety SC Department of Health and Human Services Discussion followed. **NEW BUSINESS** Dr. DesChamps stated there were no requests for additions Formulary Additions/Deletions or deletions to the Formulary. Community Paramedic Program Dr. DesChamps informed the Council that the Community Paramedic Program was presented to the Medical Control Committee prior in the day with the initial set of protocols. The protocols will be the same as the other pre-hospital state protocols, recommended, but agencies may do what works for them locally. Ms. Craig presents the Community Paramedic Pilot information. Mr. Rice made a motion to take the Community Paramedic Program off of pilot and opened statewide. Ms. Hession seconds. Discussion follows. The motion passed. Mr. Warren made the motion to approve the guideline protocols and to include the protocols in a packet given when a service requests to start a Community Paramedic Program. Dr. DesChamps added the service is not bound by the protocols but can change and amend them as necessary for their service. However, any changes must be reported to the Bureau. Dr. DesChamps introduced Mr. Fitts who presented the Medically Facilitated Intubation Pilot finding of the Medically Facilitated Intubation Pilot. The following 4 components were already approved by the Medical Control Committee: The procedure is restricted to the same paramedics who would provide RSI if there were an RSI program; must have 2 years experience as a paramedic.

Program may contain RSI or stand alone MFI. 100% Q/A by medical control physician.

Training has to be the same as for RSI.

Allow MFI using any approved formulary drugs.

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	Discussion followed.

	Committee to revisit the 2 years experience as a
	paramedic requirement.

OTC Drugs and the Formulary	Dr. DesChamps stated the Medical Control Committee
OTE Drugs and the Formulary	approved allowing the use of OTC medicines, particularly
	for events where there are "walk-in" patients and for
	tactical officers. It would require a patient care report
	because it is a patient contact.
	Dr. DesChamps cautioned that the Bureau would have to
	check with LLR as to whether or not this change would
	require a service status to change from non-dispensing to
	dispensing.

	Ms. Youmans made a motion to further investigate the
	logistics of allowing the use of OTC medications
	particularly when there are "walk-in" patients at events
	or tactical situations. The Bureau will review with LLC
	regarding whether or not a dispensing pharmacy license is
	needed.
